Yocha Dehe Golf Club To Reopen Friday

Play Resumes on Award-Winning Golf Course After County Updates

Public Health Orders

Brooks, Calif. – For the first time in more than a month, golfers will be able to tee off at one of the region's premiere golf courses this weekend.

The course at the Yocha Dehe Golf Club has been closed since March 17, when the leadership team of Cache Creek Casino Resort and resort owners, Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation, made the decision to suspend operations due to concerns over COVID-19.

Yolo County health officials later issued a shelter-in-place order, and non-essential businesses were closed. But updated orders have now been issued, allowing for some businesses that host outdoor activities to reopen.

"We are so pleased that the guidance allows for golfing to resume," said Cache Creek Casino Resort General Manager Kari Stout-Smith. "We know there are lots of physical and mental health benefits to getting outdoors and getting active. There's no better tonic for cabin fever than fresh air and sunshine."

While play will resume, there will be some changes out on the links. Social distancing will still be observed, and golfers will ride one-to-a-cart. The Yocha Dehe Golf Club's Bahtenta Restaurant will remain closed, but food will be available for golfers to purchase out on the par 72, championship course.

While the rest of Cache Creek Casino Resort remains closed for the time being, Tribal leaders say they view reopening the golf course as a great first step toward recovery, and look forward to opening the resort's many other amenities as soon as it can be done in a responsible fashion.
